APPLICATION QUESTIONS:

- 1. Read **Genesis 4:16**. Reflect on the significance of Cain going away from the presence of the Lord. How should the reality of sin separating us from God motivate us to trust Christ and obey him?
- 2. Read **Micah 6:6-8**. How might you be tempted to go through the motions of a religious life without actually doing what God wants? How can you guard your heart from faithless religious activity?
- 3. Read **Proverbs 1:24-31**. How have you ever experienced consequences from ignoring the warnings of God's wisdom? How can you grow more sensitive to listening to your conscience and other ways that God seeks to warn us?
- 4. Read **Psalm 32:5**. Why is acknowledging our sin such an important part of restoration (whether with God or with others)? How can you grow in taking responsibility for your own sin?
- 5. Read **Hebrews 10:19-22**. While sin separates us from God, why is it practically important for you to remember that the "new and living way" to God has been opened by the work of Christ and not our own works?
